The Youth Wellness Program was officially in motion the following weekend! The new mayor, Mike Galime, asked the group to extend the program to all ages and make it Thursday-Sunday 4-8 p.m.

They offer social/emotional learning opportunities for all ages through sports, activities, arts and crafts while also connecting attendees to community resources. Now, the COMMUNITY Wellness Program serves between 50 and 100 community members at a time and they don't see it stopping anytime soon!
