Mary Stronach visited Nigeria and Togo in April and will share her experiences at this week's meeting (which starts at noon Thursday, May 16, at Mid-York Library, 1600 Lincoln Ave., Utica).

A retired foreign language teacher, Mary operates a translation and interpreter-training service. She is a Spanish and Italian interpreter herself, having worked in hospital settings in Central New York and at international gatherings in Rome, Italy.

As the general vice minister of the worldwide Secular Franciscan Order, she has made official visits to the Vatican and has met Pope Francis twice. She also travels to other countries to meet with Franciscan fraternities there.

Last year and earlier this year, she was one of the speakers at nuclear diaarmament conferences held in Assisi, Italy (which also featured an ambassador, nuclear scientists and an army general, among others).

At one time she was involved in Rotary Youth Exchange, including serving as district YE chair. Her son Anthony, who teaches Spanish, Italian and Japanese at SUNY Oswego, was a Rotary exchange student to Japan.


Clinton students to visit again

Urban Tree Project looks to plant 40 trees this year

The Urban Tree Planting Project, a collaborative effort by the Rotary Club of Utica, The Unitarian Universalist Church of Utica and the City of Utica Parks Department, will be planting 40 trees across the city in 2024.

Furthermore, after this year's campaign, the project will have seen a total of 100 new trees planted since its inception, reports Rotarian project chair David Jones.

The Urban Tree Planting Project is looking for City of Utica homeowners who are interested in receiving a free tree, which will be delivered and planted at no charge. Homeowners would be required to care for the trees for a minimum of five years.

Funding for this project is made possible through a Department of Environmental Conservation grant specific to Urban communities for tree planting in disadvantaged communities.

The goal is for the trees to thrive over many years and serve to enhance the value of these properties, improving the air quality within the community by reducing carbon emissions, provide a canopy of shade to lower the heat index during summer months, and as recent studies have found, trees planted in urban areas have served to reduce the level of crime.

Interested Utica homeowners should download the application on the Unitarian Universalist Church of Utica's <u>website</u>. The deadline to apply is June 1. If you have any questions during the process, feel free to contact the UU Climate Action Team at 315-351-2591.

Varieties of trees available in 2024 included White Birch, Maple Blaze, Cherry varieties, Northern Red Oak, White Oak, American Linden and more.
