## Volunteers needed to help plant trees on November 16

Proceeds from the Rotary Club of Utica Tees for Trees golf tournament held in August have been used to purchase 17 trees for 15 Utica families. These trees need to be planted before the weather turns too cold. The City of Utica will auger the holes and leave mulch and stake wires, but volunteers are needed to plant the trees, stake, and mulch.

**Planting will take place on Tuesday, November 16, starting at 9 a.m., rain or shine.** Three teams of three to four persons are needed. With at least nine volunteers, planting should be done by noon.

Volunteers will meet at 922 Saratoga Street, at which time they will be given an orientation on planting and then break into three groups to plant about five trees at three residences. No heavy lifting is involved; volunteers should bring gloves, rake, shovel, and mallet or hammer.
