On the subject of giving, many Rotarians would agree that an excellent cause to support is the Rotary Foundation, which was the main topic of the meeting, and who better to speak about it than Past District Governor and Past Utica Rotary President Don Reese, who has served as the district's Rotary Foundation Committee Chair and will continue to serve in that role with CNY Rotary.

Don has been a Group Study Exchange Committee Chair, a District Trainer, a Regional Rotary Foundation Coordinator, a Rotary International President's Representative and served on the District's Foundation Committee as Sub-Chair for Global Grants from 2014-2021. He has multiple Paul Harris awards, a member of the Paul Harris Society and District Polio Plus Society and is a Bequest Society Member. He has also been involved with the Council on Legislation.

Don reminded Rotarians that donations to the Foundation, which was founded in 1917, returns in three years to our district in the form of grants, unlike donations we may make to other organizations.

Since it was founded more than 100 years ago, the Foundation has spent more than \$4 billion on life-changing, sustainable projects. According to the Foundation's website, for as little as 60 cents, a child can be protected from polio, and a \$50 donation can provide clean water to help fight waterborne illness.
