Rotarians get muddy for Urban Tree Planting Project

Under extremely wet and muddy conditions, nine Rotarians from area Rotary clubs came together on Tuesday, November 16, to plant 15 trees throughout the City of Utica for the Urban Tree Planting Project. Volunteer arborist Chris Mercurio provided expert instructions for planting the trees, which included varieties of White Birch, Maple Blaze, Pear, Northern Red Oak, Japanese Lilac, and American Linden.

Funding for Urban Tree Planting Project was made possible through money raised from Rotary Club of Utica's Tees for Trees golf outing held in August. The project is a cooperative program with The Rotary Club of Utica, Mohawk Valley Community Action Agency, The Adirondack Mountain Club, The Unitarian Universalist Church's "Climate Action Team," and the City of Utica Parks Department. The goal is for the trees to thrive over many years and serve to enhance the value of these properties through pride of ownership, improve the air quality within the community by reducing carbon emissions, provide a canopy of shade to lower the heat index during summer months and, as recent studies have found, trees planted in urban areas have served to reduce the level of crime.
