Some 29 Utica Rotarians and friends broke up into groups to plant another 40 trees across the city on Saturday, as part of the Urban Tree Planting project, a cooperative program with The Unitarian Universalist Church, Rotary Club of Utica, and the City of Utica Parks Department.

Following Saturday's success, the project has now planted an impressive total of 100 trees since its inception. "Thank you to all of our volunteers for their incredible work," said PP Dave Jones, who leads our club's involvement in this project. "Driving down James Street and seeing the newly planted trees filled me with pride, knowing that future generations will benefit from our efforts. It's service like this that makes me proud to be a Rotarian. Great job, everyone!"

The Urban Tree Planting Proj-

ect offers trees (delivered and planted) to homeowners in the City of Utica at no cost. Homeowners must care for the trees for at least five years.

This grant-funded initiative aims to enhance property values, improve air quality by reducing carbon emissions, provide shade to lower summer heat, and contribute to reducing crime in urban areas.
