NOV. 6TH SPEAKER BRINGS EYE CARE TO POOR IN HAITI

The featured speaker for our meeting on Thursday, Nov. 6, is Dr. Anshu Chandra, who has worked in Haiti for the last 15 years building

and advancing eye care for the poor.

The meeting starts at noon at the Mid-York Library headquarters, 1600 Lincoln Ave., Utica.

The optometrist is working to end disparities in eye care globally by bringing this service to remote areas. She has built a permanent eye clinic in Fond-des-Blancs and is collaborating with other institu-

tions in Haiti to provide care via mobile clinics.

She is also helping to further develop the Haitian ophthalmology residency program in Port-au-Prince.

> She holds a Doctor of Optometry degree and did her residency at SUNY College of Optometry in New York. She was raised in India and the USA where her mother worked as a social worker with under-served communities.

> Dr. Chandra has also provided eye care to communities in Nepal, Peru, Lebanon, Tanzania, Honduras, Guatemala, Dominican Republic, Mexi-

co, Indonesia, and India.



RIP ROBERT DELLECESE

Long-time Utica Rotarian Robert B. Dellecese, a World War II veteran, passed away on Oct. 20. He

graduated from Proctor High School in 1944 and then was inducted into the U.S. Navy, seeing action at Okinawa in early 1945. After the war he attended Utica College, earning a Bachelor of Science degree. He joined the family's contracting business and eventually became a certified real estate appraiser, a licensed real estate broker and a

licensed Public Fire Insurance adjuster. That led

him to teaching appraisal and real estate courses for at Utica College. Robert's public service rbegan with

> his appointment by then-Mayor Dominick Assaro as the first sole Commissioner of Assessment & Taxation. In 1984, Governor Mario Cuomo appointed him as a commissioner on the Board of Equalization and Assessment. In addition to Rotary, Robert had been involved with Optimist Club, Fort Schuyler American Legion Post, Sons of Italy, American Red Cross Utica Chapter board, Utica

Public Library board, and Stanley Theatre board.

30 NEW TREES PLANTED, BRINGING TOTAL TO 153

Rotarians and students from Proctor High School joined forces on Saturday morning for this year's Urban Tree Planting Project, a collaboration between the Rotary Club of Utica, the Unitarian Universalist Church of Utica, and the City of Utica Parks Department.

Together, they planted 30 new trees across East and West Utica, bringing the total number of trees planted through the project to 153 since its inception, reports Past President Dave Jones, Utica Rotary's project coordinator.

"Thanks to the dedication of our volunteers and community partners, we're proud to celebrate the planting of 30 new trees in Utica," Dave said. "This effort not only enhances the beauty of our city, but also helps improve air quality, provides cooling shade, and contributes to a healthier, safer environment for residents. Each tree represents a lasting investment in Utica's future and

a powerful reminder of what we can accomplish together."

The Urban Tree Planting Project is part of a larger effort to expand Utica's tree canopy and promote environmental sustainability. The City of Utica recently received a five-year, \$2 million Urban Tree Planting grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture, with the Rotary Club of Utica named as one of a half-dozen community partners supporting the initiative.

The project aims to help trees thrive for years to come, enhancing property values, improving air quality by reducing carbon emissions, lowering summer heat through increased shade, and contributing to safer, more vibrant neighborhoods.
