RI has made it SO EASY for Clubs to become Peacebuilders with only 3 easy steps:

Step 1. Obtain Club Board approval of the decision

Step 2. Conduct one project or outreach or education effort a year that builds peace. Remember, ANYTHING related to *Rotary's Six Areas of Focus* are considered to be building peace, including: Promoting peace; Fighting disease; Providing clean water, sanitation, and hygiene; Saving mothers and children; Supporting education; and Growing local economies.

Step 3. Download, complete and submit online the one-page application found here:

Each Peacebuilder Club will nominate a member to be its representative on the District's Peace Committee. Then, we'll really be able to get things going!!

Last April in response to emergency relief, The Rotary Foundation established a new support fund to receive contributions for disasters that strike around the world. Entitled the Rotary Disaster Response Fund, Rotary staff in Programs and Grants are now able to reach out to the affected areas and their districts to assess the need and desire for funding. Upon a qualified response - much like a district grant - the affected district will be awarded funding in increments of up to \$25,000, consulting the TRF chair as needed. Only districts in the affected country may request a grant.

To date four such grants have been issued and the fund is now depleted. The Foundation encourages donations to the fund so that when disasters occur, Rotary will be able to help.

I am happy to say we continue to show Annual Program Fund giving growth in actual dollars and per Capita as of April year to date.
