Time to Apply for RI Peace Fellowships!!!!

The 2021 Rotary Peace Fellowship application is now open. Candidates have **until 31 May to submit** applications to their District. Each year, the Rotary Foundation awards up to 50 fellowships for master's degrees and 50 for certificate studies. The fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses. It would be so great if District 7280 could recommend at least two worthy candidates to RI for consideration in each category:

- ➤ Master's degree programs: Rotary awards fellowships for master's degrees in peace and development studies at six premier universities around the world. Teaching is grounded in practical research, and students have diverse backgrounds and professional experience. Programs vary in length from 15 to 24 months and include two to three months of applied field experience designed by the peace fellow.
- Professional development certificate program: Takes place at Chulalongkorn University, Bangkok, Thailand and at the new Rotary Peace Center that will open in 2021 at Makerere University in Kampala, Uganda. Experienced leaders gain practical tools for promoting peace and international development during an intensive, 3-month program, which includes a preliminary online course, a 10week on-site course, field studies, a social change initiative, and a one-week on-site capstone seminar.

Our District Peace Committee would be very pleased if you would pass on the information to anyone you think would make a globally competitive candidate. A benefactor has offered to help and encourage those not yet a Paul Harris Fellow to become a PHF. Foundation points will be used to match any cash donation to the Foundation, 1 point for every \$1 to make any member a first time PHF. For example, if a member has never donated to the Rotary Foundation and would like to become a PHF, a donation of \$500 will be matched with 500 points. Likewise, if someone has 800 points accumulated and needs an addition \$200 or points to become a PHF, a donation of \$100 will be matched with 100 points to reach PHF status. To obtain the match please send DG Ken a copy of the online receipt or donor form showing the amount donated. This can be done via email or hard copy. After DG Ken is able to verify the donation amount, the point transfer will be requested and the PHF recognition will be sent to the Club President.

- You can join these calls without a computer or smartphone by calling in from your home or cell phone. Dial 301-715-8592 and when it asks for the meeting id type 202 547 917#
- If you have difficulty hearing, use earphones that plug in to the computer or phone OR call in to the meeting as directed above.
- It is important everyone keep their microphones on MUTE when they are not speaking, otherwise your microphone picks up background noise that interferes with the call for everyone else.
- If connecting through a computer, keep your microphone on MUTE and press and hold down the spacebar to unmute while you talk.
- If connecting to a meeting through a phone or ipad once connected, swipe the screen to see others participating. If you log in from a computer, you will be able to see everyone participating.
