It's the perfect time to become a Peacebuilder! What is your Club already doing to promote peace in RI's 6 areas of focus????

#### Peacebuilder Clubs Update: Welcome Slippery Rock!

District #7280's effort to become the first district in the world in which every club is designated a Peacebuilder Club by Rotary International is still creeping along with one more joining the ranks. Welcome to Slippery Rock, who is the 12<sup>th</sup> Club in our District to become a Peacebuilder! Only 31 more to go! RI has made the process SO simple. Your Club's Board agrees to submit your very simple one-page application, which is normally processed within a single working day. Then you will be able to find your Club on the global Peacebuilder Map for all the world to see your Club's commitment to peace.

#### Time to Apply for RI Peace Fellowships!!!!

The 2021 Rotary Peace Fellowship application **opens on 3 February 2020.** Candidates have **until 31 May to submit** applications to their District.

Each year, the Rotary Foundation awards up to 50 fellowships for master's degrees and 50 for certificate studies. The fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses. It would be so great if District 7280 could recommend at least two worthy candidates to RI for consideration in each category:

- Master's degree programs: Rotary awards fellowships for master's degrees in peace and development studies at six premier universities around the world. Teaching is grounded in practical research, and students have diverse backgrounds and professional experience. Programs vary in length from 15 to 24 months and include two to three months of applied field experience designed by the peace fellow.
- Professional development certificate program: Takes place at Chulalongkorn University,
   Bangkok, Thailand and at the new Rotary Peace Center that will open in 2021 at Makerere
   University in Kampala, Uganda. Experienced leaders gain practical tools for promoting peace
   and international development during an intensive, 3-month program, which includes a
   preliminary online course, a 10-week on-site course, field studies, a social change initiative, and a
   one-week on-site capstone seminar.

Our District Peace Committee would be very pleased if you would pass on the information to anyone you think would make a globally competitive candidate. A benefactor has offered to help and encourage those not yet a Paul Harris Fellow to become a PHF. Foundation points will be used to match any cash donation to the Foundation, 1 point for every \$1 to make any member a first time PHF. For example, if a member has never donated to the Rotary Foundation and would like to become a PHF, a donation of \$500 will be matched with 500 points. Likewise, if someone has 800 points accumulated and needs an addition \$200 or points to become a PHF, a donation of \$100 will be matched with 100 points to reach PHF status. To obtain the match please send DG Ken a copy of the online receipt or donor form showing the amount donated. This can be done via email or hard copy. After DG Ken is able to verify the donation amount, the point transfer will be requested and the PHF recognition will be sent to the Club President.


