Fall Workshop: First Peace Committee Meeting

We had a great Fall Workshop led by District Governor Ken Fleeson in Clarion on Saturday October 19. I came away with two pages of ideas to share with my Club on improving Public Relations, Membership and Foundation Giving.

I also had the pleasure of spending time with a number of Rotarians who are actively building peace around the globe with the Guatemala Water Project, Habitat for Humanity, ShelterBox and Crutches 4 Africa. I was inspired to ask them all to come to Erie for a single meeting to show the Erie Club how the Foundation directly supports our own District members as they build peace in the world.

This occasion also allowed the District Peace Committee to hold its innaugural meeting!! Members from some of the 8 District Peace Builder Clubs and I met to discuss how we move our District Peace Project forward and encourage other Clubs in the district to get on the <u>Peacebuilder Map</u> by submitting their <u>application</u> today! Let's become the first District in the world to have all of its Clubs designated Peace Builders.

Troopers Teaching Students

Fall Workshop was also the perfect opportunity to fully kick off our District Peace Project. In order to sponsor an elementary school in the Crawford Central school district for the *Troopers Teaching Students* program, the District needs to raise \$22,000 or an average of \$513 per Club. We made the case that this pales in comparison to \$147,000, the average annual cost of keeping one young person in a secure facility when they have lost their way and failed to develop these important character traits. This is, of course, compounded by the sad loss of one of our youth from a productive, successful and happy path in life. DISTRICT MATCH FOR A NEW PAUL HARRIS FELLOW (PHF)

A benefactor has offered to help and encourage those not yet a Paul Harris Fellow to become a PHF. Foundation points will be used to match any cash donation to the Foundation, 1 point for every \$1 to make any member a first time PHF. For example, if a member has never donated to the Rotary Foundation and would like to become a PHF, a donation of \$500 will be matched with 500 points. Likewise, if someone has 800 points accumulated and needs an addition \$200 or points to become a PHF, a donation of \$100 will be matched with 100 points to reach PHF status. To obtain the match please send DG Ken a copy of the online receipt or donor form showing the amount donated. This can be done via email or hard copy. After DG Ken is able to verify the donation amount, the point transfer will be requested and the PHF recognition will be sent to the Club President.
