Speaker - Guest of Russ Christian; Congressman Mark Pocan Mark Pocan is an American politician and businessman who has served in the United States House of Representatives, representing Wisconsin's 2nd congressional district, since 2013.

He said some things are difficult to get done because of the upcoming presidential election and some people who want to block the process. This is a tough period in history but they did get some things done; education acts, transportation, lift the debt ceiling with no government shutdown. He serves on the Budget Committee and Education & Workforce Committee. Mark discussed the Hastard Rule* and how he would like to see it go away in order to help things function better.

The most positive part of the job is helping individuals with their needs. Wisconsin's

2nd congressional district is a congressional district of the United States House of Representatives in southern Wisconsin, covering Dane County, Iowa County, Lafayette County, Sauk County, and Green County, as well as portions of Richland County and Rock County.
