Barbara James program chairperson, introduces our speaker Arthur Clothier, Sumpter County Forrester. Who tells us that there is 17.2 Million acres of forest land in the State of Florida and that is 1/2 of the total land area in all of Florida. He also told us that the forest produces 15.3 million dollars of revenue for Florida and that there are 721 jobs as a result of forest product production. We also learned that although we personally were not hit by the hurricane, the loss of revenue to the 2.8 million acres of forest in the panhandle is 1.3 billion dollars, with a reforestation cost of 1/4 of a Billion dollars. Local Fire Fighters and Foresters fought over 3,000 fires on about 163.500 acres last year.
