Melissa's talk was on Options for Living and Care giving; how we start thinking about other options for living:1. Loneliness, 2, failure to thrive, 3, caregiver burnout, 4, concern for safety.

Most Independent Options home are:1,Live at home with a monitor button2, Have meals delivered and Dr. makes house calls 3,Hire private duty help non skilled help with chores , supervision 4,Hire skilled nursing , help with ADLs, medication management

She went on to tell us about the options away from the home and within the home:.

Day care programs provide daytime care by credentialed staff away from home and then return to the comfort of their home. Provides relieve for care givers and stimulation for those who need it.

Dependent Living Options:

Independent Living Housing Reduces stress of living “at home” such as meals, transportation and socialization

Assisted living all of the above plus various forms of assistance.

Skilled Nursing Facilities –Where there is a need for 24 hour skilled nursing care., SNF'S provide short term rehabilitation and long term care..

Hospice—end of life situations. Highly skilled staff provide comfort measures and dignity.




RJ Wooten, left, George Zablocki, Rich Troop, Frank Dochniak and Bob Dunning all served in the 82nd Airborne Division of the U.S. Army.

During Bob Dunning's 28 years of service in the U.S. Army, the veteran para-trooper made as lot of night jumps.

" you Know —With my eyes closed"" , joked Dunning, of the Village of Chatham.

" I totaled up to 268 jumps", he said, nearly all of them as a member of the 82nd Airborne Division". "I was lucky enough to be division safety officer, charged with improving jump safety and reducing the number of injuries.... So I literally would spend all my time rigging people. And if I was going to be down there, I got my self a chute and jumped with them to observe. So I stacked up a whole batch of jumps."

Dunning and many other local veterans who served in the 82nd Airborne Division are marking its centennial this month.
