The National Parks Service, Department of Interior, has 22,200 Employees covering 84 Million Acres , 413 areas with an annual budget of \$13,650.00 million dollars, and the work force is supported by over 400,000 Volunteers.

The first National Park was established March 1, 1872with inly 2 acres that is Hot Springs National Park. The Parks have been visited by an increasing number of people starting in 1920 by 1 million visitors , 1940 with 17 million visitors 1960 by 79 Million visitors , 2000 286 Million visitors and in 2015 by 307.2 million visitors, as you can see they are becoming more and more popular. Byron and his wife, Donna did most of their travels via Motor Home and covered Alaska down and through out the South West.

President Woodrow Wilson signed the "Organic Act" on August 25, 1916 and created the National Park Service. The act states that the fundamental purpose of the NPS is to conserve the scenic and natural and historic objects as well as the wild life there in and to provide for the enjoyment of the same in such a manner and by such means as will leave them unimpaired for the enjoyment of future generations.

### WHAT ARE ROTARY PEACE FELLOWSHIPS?

Each year, Rotary selects up to 100 individuals from around the world to receive fully funded academic fellowships at one of our peace centers. These fellowships cover tuition and fees, room and board, round-trip transportation, and all internship and field-study expenses.

In just over a decade, the Rotary Peace Centers have trained more than 900 fellows for careers in peace building. Many of them go on to serve as leaders in national governments, NGOs, the military, law enforcement, and international organizations like the United Nations and World Bank.

Two types of peace fellowships are available.

#### MASTER'S DEGREE

We offer master's degree fellowships at premier universities in fields related to peace and conflict prevention and resolution. Programs last 15 to 24 months and require a practical internship of two to three months during the academic break. Each year, we award up to 50 master's degree fellowships at these institutions:

Duke University and University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, USA (fact sheet)

International Christian University, Japan (fact sheet)

<u>University of Bradford</u>, England (<u>fact sheet</u>)

<u>University of Queensland</u>, Australia (<u>fact sheet</u>)

<u>Uppsala University</u>, Sweden (<u>fact sheet</u>)

#### PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT CERTIFICATE

For experienced professionals working in peace-related fields who want to enhance their professional skills, we offer a three-month program in peace and conflict prevention and resolution at <u>Chulalongkorn University</u> in Thailand (<u>fact sheet</u>). This program incorporates two to three weeks of field study. We award up to 50 certificates each year.

The application for the 2018 Rotary Peace Fellowship program will be available in January 2017.
