Our speaker today was Dr. Juan A. Albino of The Village Sleep Lab, Dr. Albino is Board Certified in Sleep Medicine and is a former professor at Harvard Medical College.

His talk was about the dangers of not knowing the signs of Sleep Apnea, over 12-18 million people have Sleep Apnea, 1/2 are not even diagnosed and of those 1/2 are not treated. Sleep disorders are a major problem, they are very common but easily missed and can be disabling but, develop slowly. The can worsen other diseases and can even be fatal.

However they are easy to diagnose and treat.

The good Doctor reminded us of the basics of good sleep habits: Regular times for sleep and awakening, maintain a dark bedroom that is also quit and cool, try to sleep around 7-8 hours per night, avoid late daytime naps if you have trouble sleeping. He listed for us some of the common sleep disorders Insomnia, sleep deprivation, sleep apnea, restless leg syndrome, parasomnias and circadian Rhythm Disorders. These you should really check out on the web site.

There are only 40 cards on the table that is all that is left between you and the pot, as Hank draws the wrong card , the Joker is waiting for you to start over again next week.






