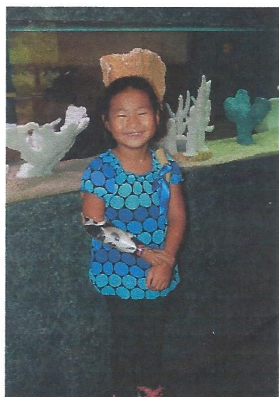

Meet Momo Sutton

Momo Sutton's story began with her mother, Sandra Andriaccio, adopting her from an orphanage in China where she served as a volunteer. As soon as she saw Momo, it was love at first sight. Andriaccio knew immediately that Momo was hers and she needed to go home with her. For a couple of days a week, she would take Momo home and then back to the orphanage. Momo contracted chicken pox at 21 months, and the orphanage directed Andriaccio not to bring her back until she was healthy. Once Momo recovered, she remained at Andriaccio's home.

"I laugh and say it is the longest case of chicken pox ever as she never returned except to play with the other children when I volunteered," Andriaccio recalled. After going through a tedious three-year process, Momo was officially adopted, and they returned to the United States. They now live in the Orlando, Fla. area.

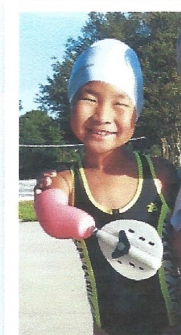
Momo has a congenital amputation of her right arm, but she has not let that stop her from being an active school aged girl. She enjoys horseback riding, swimming, playing soccer, basketball, softball and doing gymnastics. She has recently taken up golf.

The prosthetists in the P.O.P.S department at Shriners Hospitals for Children® – Tampa help keep Momo and other patients active by designing custom limbs and adjusting or replacing them as the children grow or develop new interests. They even create special limbs so kids can participate in sports or other activities such as music.

When Momo received her very first swim arm, she was eager to get into the pool to try it out. Instead of hiding her swim arm or just ignoring it, Momo raised it high above her head to show it off. "She swam like a fish, fast and smooth," said Momo's mother, Sandra Andriaccio. She has already completed the first six levels of Red Cross swim lessons. When Momo expressed interest in learning to play the violin, the prosthetists designed her an attachment that allows her to manipulate the bow. She is taking lessons and already can play several songs.

Momo is frequently called upon as a patient ambassador and her positive outlook is always well received. Some of the events she has attended include the Sam Swope Charity Ride, Lake County Shrine Club Fashion Show and Orlando Kiwanis Club. She has also been a part of various film opportunities that range from a Publix commercial to recently being a part of NFL "Play 60 – All Ability" commercial.

Momo's family lives in the Kissimmee area, just a little more than 75 miles from Daytona Beach, the city that will host Shriners International's Imperial Session in 2018 from July 15 – 19. Imperial Session is the annual business meeting of Shriners International. Delegates from each temple meet to discuss and vote on a variety of business matters pertaining to the fraternity and Shriners Hospitals for Children.
