Our speaker today was Irving Locker, Veteran of WW2 and who was recently honored by The President of The United States, you may have seen him on TV at the President's State of the Union address. If you missed this meeting you missed a good one.

On June 6th (D-Day) He landed on the shores of Normandy at Utah Beach, as a Staff Sargent at the age of 19, he was in charge of 65 men and all of the anti-aircraft guns including the ammunition, which consisted of shells that where 3 ft tall and weighing 45 pounds each.

He not only was on Utah beach but the infamous "Battle of the Bulge".

He talked about the "Ghost Army the Allied Army had set up in England to make the Germans think that the invasion would take place somewhere else, this consisted of inflatable tanks and trucks, as well as Anti Air Craft Guns.

He also help liberate one of the "Death Camps that were part of the Holocaust.
