Rotary Membership, Benefits & Responsibilities

Rotary International

Rotary is a worldwide organization of more than 1.2 million business, professional, and community leaders. Members of Rotary clubs, known as Rotarians, provide humanitarian service, encourage high ethical standards in all vocations, and help build goodwill and peace in the world.

There are over 32,000 Rotary clubs in more than 200 countries and geographical areas. Clubs are nonpolitical, nonreligious, and open to all cultures, races, and creeds. As signified by the motto "Service Above Self", Rotary's main objective is service — in the community, in the workplace, and throughout the world.

Membership

Rotary membership is by invitation.

A prospective member first experiences Rotary as a guest of a current member. The member may then submit a proposal for membership on behalf of their guest. The proposal is reviewed by the club's board of directors and then submitted for approval to the club. A formal invitation to membership may then be extended.

Benefits of Membership

- A broader circle of friends and acquaintances
- Greater understanding of what's going on in your community and the world
- Increased knowledge of professions and businesses other than your own
- Opportunities for greater self fulfillment through service to others
- Chance to develop your talents and capacities in roles of leadership and support

IMPORTANT: *The primary goals of Rotary are fellowship and service to others, not the promotion of one's personal or business interests.*

Membership Responsibilities

- Attend at least 60% of weekly club meetings (or take advantage of the many opportunities to "make-up" absences at other clubs or on-line)
- Lend your time and talents to club programs and initiatives.

- Support club efforts by participating in club fund raising activities
- Respond promptly to quarterly billings for meals/dues
- Spread the word about Rotary and the Holmen Area Rotary Club
- Share Rotary fellowship with others
