

Ann Chaffin- Executive Director "Rebuilding Together" was our speaker for the day. Rebuilding Together is a non profit

organization which was formed in 1999 to supply free home repairs to qualified low income and elderly home owners in Lincoln as well as families with a disabled member, so that they may continue to live in warmth. safety and independence. They help homeowners who do not have the resources to hire the work

out and do not have the physical ability to do the work themselves. Priorities for the work are warmth, safety and independence not cosmetic changes.

The organization started as a local affiliate of the national organization "Christmas in April" which did free home repairs during the month of April. It became quite clear after awhile however, that some needs could not wait for the annual event and needed to be resolved immediately. Therefore the organization changed it's name to "Rebuilding Together" and began to provide assistance year round.

While the nationwide organization does repairs for both individuals and other not-for-profit organizations, the Lincoln affiliate just does residential homes. Todate they provided repairs on 140 homes in Lincoln while the need has been identified in excess of 4.000 homes so there is a lot of work to be done. As a result of the huge demand, todate they have not advertised their service but obtain work through referrals

primarily through the city and occupational rehab departments in the area hospitals. All repairs are provided to the recipients

> free of charge and they attempt to fill gaps not covered by other services such as Habitat for Humanity which builds new homes. A House Selection Committee reviews all applications and determines which homes will be repaired based upon immediate need and the ability of the organization to complete the work.

They receive funding from Community Development Block Grants from the City, grants from local and national organizations, from their national affiliate and through donated time and materials from local residents and businesses. Some of their goals for this year include establishing services for veterans as well as families of those currently serving in the military.

There are many opportunities for individuals and organizations to help. Many organizations such as Club 14 sponsor a house and provide the volunteer labor to do the repairs on the annual rebuild day which is held in April in conjunction with the national organization. Board members and committee members are also needed and individual volunteers are always welcome. The average cost of repairs per home is \$2,500 and the goal is to have most of the labor and materials donated. Currently they use 100-150 volunteers per year but have the capacity for many more.
