

PROGRAM

The annual Rotary International Foundation drive to raise money for the Foundation begins December 1st and runs through the end of January. To help members understand where their contributions are going, November is designated as Foundation Month where all of the programs in November will have speakers who will tell the club about all of the programs that the Foundation sponsors. Friday's program was about the Group Study Exchange which is one of 2 educational programs sponsored by the Foundation. (Ambassadorial Scholarship Program is the 2nd)

Joyce Schmeeckle who has helped coordinate the visit for the inbound team for a number of years led the discussion. Joyce began by doing a Q&A to see how much we knew about the GSE program. For instance each team is made up of 5 or 6 team members who must be non Rotarians between the ages of 25-40. The team leader is a Rotarian and no family members of Rotarians can participate. There is no cost to team members for the trip and no restrictions on what professions can be represented or the gender of the team members.

Ruth Gerber from Club 14 who led a GSE team to India in 2002 then spoke to the club about her experiences. Ruth feels that the reason the program is so effective is the fact that the teams stay in the homes of Rotarians which enables them to get much closer to the culture than they would if they were staying in hotels. They get to know the families intimately and experience their

daily lives. She also urged the program to select challenging cultures where conditions are unique or difficult for the program to be most effective.

Eric Drumheller was on the team that recently went to Sweden this spring with our own Joe Roberts as team leader. He echoed Ruth's sentiments regarding the time spent in the homes of the Rotarians. Eric said the hardest thing

for him to do was to try to link his profession to a comparable profession in their culture. Since Sweden is a socialist country where all education is paid by the government, Eric's profession which is to help people find assistance to get into college had no comparable position in Sweden. His host families could not comprehend the cost of health care in the US. On the other hand they have long waiting lists to get certain procedures even though they are free.

Dean Heermann then spoke to the group about his experiences hosting inbound GSE teams which he has been doing for a number of years. He urged all members to host people from other countries as it is such an enriching experience. He also stressed that we should show the visiting teams all parts of our culture, not just the living standard of Rotary members. Dean was particularly touched by the visiting team from South Korea since he spent time in Korea during the Korean war. He shared a story about how communication with the Korean team did not really open up until they all sat cross legged on his basement floor which is how they were most comfortable. Anyone who hosts a team should try to understand their culture and try to communicate with them in a way which puts them at ease.


