Bob Grundman with Senior Benefit Strategies spoke to the club on Friday about new Long Term Healthcare Legislation for Nebraska. Bob told the club that the greatest financial risk for families is long term care. Statistics show that we have a 1 in 150 chance of a house fire and a 1 in 25 chance of filing an auto insurance claim but we historically insure ourselves for those items. One in three people will need long term health care and most of us do not insure for that. The definition of long term care is when assistance is required for 90 days or more to do 2 of 6 activities of daily living which include bathing, dressing and eating among others. 90% of claims on long term health care plans are related to bathing difficulties. Men have a 50% chance of needing long term care while women have a 75% chance since they generally live longer than men. The issue is not just for the elderly as 40% of claims are from people who are under 65. Originally long term plans only covered nursing home costs but they since have been expanded to cover assisted living and home health care.

The average annual growth in Medicaid claims has recently increased to approximately 11%. Given that the state

will not be able to continue to fund Medicaid claims at that pace, in 2006 the state legislature adopted 2 bills to incent people to provide for their own long term health care.

LB265— The Nebraska Long-Term Care Savings Act allows individuals to contribute a Nebraska income-tax deductible \$1,000 per year into the plan which grows tax free and can be used to fund long term care expenses, premiums on long term care insurance or deductibles.

LB854 allows the state to participate in the National Long Term Care Partnership Plan which offers a way for individuals to protect assets they want to pass on to their beneficiaries. If an individual purchases \$100,000 in LT care insurance, they can retain \$100,000 in assets and still get Medicaid after the \$100,000 in insurance benefits are gone. Even if they ultimately use Medicaid, this \$100,000 of protected assets would not be subject to Medicaid lien upon their death. Under this plan, very few people ultimately have to use Medicaid which saves the state money.

The time to start thinking about long term health care is after age 40. Once you have a policy in place, you should also revisit the coverage every so many years as the benefits may be outdated.
