

PROGRAM

Amy Cyphers-Carr gave a very energetic presentation about "Girls on the Run". Amy is the director of Girls on the

Run in Lincoln which is a nonprofit fitness, education and mentoring program for young girls. This is an after school program which originated in North Carolina with 13 girls. There are now 160 councils across the US which served 40,000 girls last year. The Lincoln

program started in 2003 with 11 girls and expanded to Omaha in 2004. A total of 1,900 girls have been served todate by the Lincoln and Omaha programs.

The participants in the program meet 1 hour per week for 2 months and train to complete a 5K race. There is national standardized program which includes a theme for each day and a lot of games and motivational activities for the girls to get them to run. They use constant positive feedback and try to make the environment very supportive of the girls. The object is to teach the girls goal setting skills which will help them to pursue healthy habits as they grow and become adults. While weight loss is not the goal, it many times is a result of the program along with a great boost in the self confidence of the girls.

Studies show that young people who are physically active engage in less risky behaviors when they hit adolescence.

Childhood obesity and dwindling physical education programs are also contributing factors to the need for the program.

The grand finale of the program is the 5K run which is held twice per year. Some of the

results of the program have included better body image, higher self esteem and healthier habits for the girls who participate. In fact many girls come back multiple times. This program is the first step to a life of health and wellness for all of

those who participate. Volunteers are always needed to serve as coaches for the girls or to volunteer to help with the 5K or other special events held throughout the year.
