





The program provides a Planning with Purpose course inside the prison which lasts 20 weeks and combines a study of the book "The Purpose Driven Life" with teaching new and constructive thinking skills. They are currently doing their 7th 20 week session with 14 gradu-



An additional goal of the program is to educate the public on how to help ex inmates to leave their life of crime behind. They also have a job readiness program which helps teach inmates skills which will make them employable when they are released from prison.

Participants voluntarily choose to be in the program which began in Nebraska in 2004.
