

### **PROGRAM**

The club heard from our out-

bound and inbound Youth Exchange students on Friday. Audrey Foucault, our inbound student from France spoke first. She told the club that she has been here months and likes school. Life in the

US has been quite an adjustment for her as our

cultures are very different. For instance, she was not used to going to church every Sunday. She is taking French and art classes and would like to pursue art maybe as a career. She was also the student

manager for the girls volleyball team this year. She has gotten to do some

traveling in the US while she has been here to places such as Denver and Washington DC. She said that her biggest adjustment to life in the US was the food which is very different than what she is used to at home.

Corinne Watson, our outbound student to France spoke to the club about her experiences. She was in France for 10 months in a town about 30

minutes south of Paris. One of the biggest differences that she had to get used to was the fact that everyone uses public transportation to get around versus getting in their cars and driving. She went to private Catholic school and made many friends there. The school environment was very different and teachers were not supportive like they are in

the US. They are there to teach the subject and do not help the students

who are having difficulty with a particular subject. She stayed with 8 host families in total so she spent a good deal of time moving from one family to the next. She loved the French food and tried a lot of new things such as rabbit, frog legs and duck which was her favorite. She was able to travel extensively in Europe during her 10 months and

visited many cities and countries such as Germany, Austria, Switzerland, Italy, Spain, Monaco and London just to name a few.
