Twelve Rotarians, including LSR's own Nicki Klein, represented District 5650,

on a trip to Africa in the country of Zambia, in the city of Livingstone, pronounced "Livingston". District 5650 has chosen to partner with the Rotary Club of Livingstone for the next 5 years to help with many of their projects. One of their

affiliations is with the Sons of Thunder farm near Livingstone where they have helped with many projects including converting buildings to classrooms, starting a medical clinic and converting chicken coops for an orphanage just to name a few.

All of the traveling took place in "game viewers". During the day the weather was a dry

80-85 degrees, but the evenings were cold and re-

quired coats, mittens, and in Nicki's case earmuffs.

The average life expectancy for the people of Zambia is 39. Most of the deaths occur from HIV and AIDS, but also Malaria. The people of Zambia have a pure and uncomplicated life. They don't require very much to be happy. They have a different outlook on money believing that it is to be shared and often money earmarked for certain things ends up going to fund things deemed more important at the time. Some parameters were put into place to deal with this issue and satisfy Rotary International. The district pledged to help for 5 years, with matching grants, and are now in the 3rd year. There is not a single focus, but rather a broad focus on helping the people of Zambia, with respect for and in harmony with their culture, and at the same time

maintaining their dignity and their sense of pride - giving them a hand-up and not a hand-out.


> Of all the places visited, the orphanage was everyone's favorite. Since none of these children are available for adoption the orphanage is a permanent home for the children. The staff is dedicated to providing a loving environment, and to raising these children with the thought that these are the country's future leaders.

Water is available but since the children are unable to get water without a staff worker they sometimes have to wait for a drink. During the trip Nicki purchased a water cooler on behalf of Lincoln South Rotary Club and presented it to the orphanage. (See picture at left) They can now get their own water and hopefully this will help with dehydration issues. (See Thank You letter on page 4).

During this trip, the focus was to provide training to the 35 orphanage workers. In order to keep the orphanage

staffed, the training needed to be brought to them. Within the 12 Rotarians on the trip, the specialists included a pediatrician, a nurse, a documents specialist, a marketing specialist, a child development worker and a nutritionist. The first week of the trip was about making observations and building trust. From these observations a curriculum was created. The second week a classroom setting was created, and for the next four days classes were taught, 2 sessions each day, so that everyone would be able to attend. The workers were very receptive to the training and there was 100% attendance for all 4 days.

The last week the team treated themselves by going to Chobe National Park, spending 2 nights in Botswana and Nibya on a photo safari. Some exceptional photos were shared of native wildlife.
