PROGRAM

Our speakers for the day were Maira Mogues & Florencia Sciutto, 2 Youth Exchange students visiting from Argentina. Maira attended Southeast high school while Florencia attended Northeast. Maira and Florencia gave a presentation on their country to the club. They are from the Santa Fe Province in Argentina and come from a town of about 3,000 people. Both of their fathers are farmers who raise corn and soybeans much like in the US and both have cattle as well.

Argentina has great variations in climate as it covers a great distance from equatorial climate in the north to Antarctic climate in the south. They showed pictures of the varied landscapes in the country. They both attend private school in Argentina where they are required to wear uniforms. They will graduate from high school this year when they return. Unlike in the US, they are required to select their future field of study while they are still in high school but both of them are yet to decide what they want to study.

They talked about Tango which originated in Argentina and Mate which is a very popular drink similar to tea. Their favorite food in the US so far is Runza's and the food they miss most from Argentina is Asado which a form of grilled beef. They both thought that Argentineans eat healthier than Americans since they eat a lot of beef and vegetables and not so many processed foods.

The club presented each of them with Lincoln South Rotary pins, a Rotary tin of chocolates and a Lincoln South banner to take back to the Rotary club which sponsored them.
