Joyce Halvorsen, Public Relations director for the Community Blood Bank was our speaker for the day. The Community Blood Bank was formed by the Lancaster County Medical Society and has been a

primary blood provider to area hospitals since 1968. Prior to that time each Hospital had its own system for obtaining blood. Usually it was just a rolodex file of names to call when they needed blood. Blood was not stored but donated and used the same day. She shared a story of an individual who remembered many years ago actually being directly hooked up to the patient!

PROGRAM

The Blood Bank collects for 12 hospitals in 6 counties and has 4 collection sites. The main site at 84th &

O also does all of the testing and distribution in addition to collection. The Blood Bank also has 3 mobile units which do blood drives at various schools and businesses around the area. They do 1 blood drive every 8 weeks. The national average for donors is to give 1.5 times per year but donors in Lincoln average 2.8 times per year.

The criteria for donating blood is that you must be at least 15 years of age, weigh at least 115 lbs., be in general good health and have not had a tattoo in the last 12 months. Donors are also questioned for risk factors for hepatitis and HIV and would be disqualified if they have hepatitis or HIV or if they have one or more risk factors for either disease. People who have



had cancer are eligible if it was not cancer of the blood and they have been cancer free for 5 years.

It only takes a total of 1 hour

to donate blood and the needle is in only 7 minutes of that hour. The rest of the time is filling out paperwork etc. That one hour can save 3 lives. Only 1 out of 20 people donate blood so the Blood Bank is constantly trying to get the word out to get more donors.

There are 3 parts of blood that are collected: Platelets which only last 5 days, red cells which last 42 days and plasma which can be frozen for up to

one year. The Blood Bank tries to maintain a 5-7 day blood supply but this can be a challenge since there is no way to predict what the needs might be in any week. Several major traumas can use all of the available supply. Cancer patients are the #1 users of blood donations.

Joyce showed a short video of a family who's baby was saved by donated blood and how the Blood Bank brought the donor and the family of the recipient together. Joyce encourage everyone to become a regular blood donor as blood saved 4 million lives last year. If for some reason you can't donate, be a volunteer to help with the process.
