

### **PROGRAM**

Our speaker for the day was Roxanne Smith who is the Tourism supervisor at the state Capitol. Roxanne showed

the club pictures of the recent renovation of the West Chamber and lounge at the capitol. The renovation began in April 2008 and was completed in De-



cember 2008. As part of the renovation, UNL art students cleaned the ceiling by hand using such tools as toothbrushes and Q tips for the really detailed work. The pictures showed the dramatic difference after removing 70 years of dirt!

A lot of the stains in the ceiling area were from the flat roof leaking over the years. After the stains were removed, some of the wood surfaces then had to be re varnished.

The limestone walls were cleaned by painting them with a latex material which contained detergent. After the latex dried it was pulled off of the walls in large sheets taking all of the dirt with it.

A new copper roof was put on the West Chamber which has been sealed from the weather & moisture and new glass doors were installed which keep out

the noise from the Rotunda.

There were originally 2 legislative chambers with lounges in the capitol. The east chamber is no longer in use and has

> been converted to offices. In the 70's all of the rooms were named for former senators and representatives. The East Chamber is named after Kenneth Wherry and the West Chamber is named after Senator George W. Norris. New technology was also added as part of the renovation and you can now see live web

streaming of hearings, governor's news conferences, supreme court sessions etc.

Roxanne told the club that approximately 100,000 people visit the capitol each year. For more information about the capitol go to www.capitol.org . You can also click on the State Government Link to get information about all of the different government branches.
