

Davis and Vanessa Butters from the UNL Police Dept. were our speakers for the day. The topic was Meth 360 or how meth affects not only the users but how it comes full circle to affect the community as whole.



and anhydrous ammonia to name a few.

It first started to show up in eastern Nebraska in 1997 when it began coming through Falls City. Since then there has been a dramatic drop in meth lab seizures primarily due to the fact that the public began to report it. Also today 65-70% of meth used is made in super labs in Mexico and California. Even though lab seizures are down, felony arrests are up. 54% of the federal drug cases in Lincoln are meth related.

Most users are ages 18-25. Meth is not used just to get high but many people begin using it for more energy to cope with their job or stresses in life, such as working moms, truck drivers, students etc. Meth impacts the production of dopamine in the brain to increase energy, confidence, sex drive, blood pressure and heart rate and decrease inhibition, appetite and need for sleep. It creates a long lasting euphoria that can last for days. The resulting im-

pacts on the body are devastating. It ruins teeth & creates abscesses since users are drawn to sugar drinks and don't practice

any hygiene. Some of the long term impacts are paranoia, hallucinations, skin crawling, depression, obsessive behavior, agitation, insomnia, aggression, violent convulsions and death. Users lose the ability to assign value to things and to

reference themselves in space. Meth changes the

brain's chemistry and after awhile the user no longer experiences the euphoria. The addiction is treatable but of the 22 million users in the US, only 3 million seek treatment.

The impact on the community is great. Meth labs are highly explosive and can be very dangerous both to the occupants and the neighborhood. 1 in 3 meth labs have children in the house and the users neglect them. 90% of identity thefts are drug related and hospital & emergency room care, dental care and social services are all strained by the impact of the drug.

What can you do? Educated yourselves and others. Be persistent and realize that it takes time to build a case. Be alert for signs of abuse and signs of meth production and take action when you suspect that someone is using or producing the drug. It is better to call and be wrong than not report suspicious behavior. Talk to your kids over and over. Kids who learn about drugs from their parents are 50% less likely to use drugs.
