

#### **PROGRAM**

Karen Noel, President and CEO

of the Great Plains Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association was our speaker for the day. Karen spoke to the club about early onset Alzheimer's and showed a video done by a UNL grad student following the story of a young Lincoln man who was a victim of early onset Alzheimer's at age 51. The grad student followed the

victim and his family for 6 months to show the impact of the disease not only on the victim but also on his caregivers and family. There is a common myth that Alzheimer's only strikes older people but many victims are in their 40's and 50's. The Alzheimer's Association was originally formed for the caregivers of those who have the disease but the organization is changing to also be an advocate for those who actually have the disease.

For example when the victim in the video became so advanced that his wife could no longer care for him, there were no institutions that would take him because his disease was so advanced resulting in dramatic behavioral changes which are hard to manage. The video showed the stages get progressively worse. At one point he no longer recognize himself in the mirror. By the time he died he was functioning at the level of a 2 yr old.

The association has a lot of mate-

rial on how to identify the 10 signs of de-

mentia and to distinguish those symptoms which are normal aging. There are many forms of dementia and currently there are 3 different drugs on the market which treat symptoms in the early stages but do not stop the progression of the disease.

There is currently a drug being developed that will stop the progression of the disease. The hope is to be able to manage it as a chronic disease.

Karen had a message for family members of the victims. Concentrate on what is left not what is gone.

## Rotary International Standard Procedure for Membership Proposal:

- I. The prospective member's name is submitted to the board of directors
- II. The board ensures that the person is fully qualified and approves or disapproves of the proposal
  - Objections are to be submitted to the club secretary (or to any other Board Member in the event
  - It will be appropriate to assume approval in the absence of objections by the posted deadline.
  - The proposer is notified by the club secretary of the Board's approval (or disapproval). UNTIL THIS APPROVAL IS GRANTED, PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS SHOULD NOT BE INFORMED THAT THEY HAVE BEEN PROPOSED FOR MEMBERSHIP
- III The prospective member's name is published to the club
  - If no objections are received by the deadline following the publication of the name, that person, upon payment of an admission fee (secured by the proposer) is a new Rotarian
- The prospective member is informed of privileges and responsibilities of the club membership by proposer.
  - He or she is then asked to complete the membership application form and submit along with their dues payment.
- V. Any and all communications within these procedures may be in person, in writing, by phone, by fax, by email, or by any other physical or electronic means available to the Board Member.
