# PROGRAM

Olga Mun an IREX Student from Kazakhstan who is studying at SCC was

our speaker and told the club a little about her country and culture. Olga's father is Korean and her mother is Russian so she truly comes from a multi-cultural family. Kazakhstan has the 9th largest land area in the world. It is rich in natural resources as the country contains every element of the periodic table.

While the official language is Kazakh, most of the people there speak Russian. 55% of the population

is Kazakh, 30% are Russians and Koreans and Germans are in the minority. As a result, international relations are extremely important to the country. The country is a member of the UN and is bordered by Russia and China. Since the country achieved independence in 1991, they have had one president who will probably govern the country for his entire lifetime.

Since its independence, the country has undergone many changes such as the location of the capital, the currency, the National Anthem and the educational system just to name a few. The country in its current form is young and feels that it has a great future ahead. Consequently the leaders have a tendency to

want all the change to occur at once which can be very difficult at times. One example is the educational system which is changing to an American system which requires everything to be taught in English even though many teachers may not speak English very well quite yet.

Olga has studied 4 languages, Kazakh, Russian, English and German. Most inhabitants speak at least 3 languages but use Russian

the most. Many students also now study Chinese and go to China to study which is cheaper. In fact the Kazakh government sponsors a program which pays the cost for students to study abroad with the stipulation that they return to Kazakhstan for a minimum of 5 years. 1,500 students are currently studying in the US and England on this program.

Most of the bigger cities are multi-national while the rural areas are more Kazakh. There is a movement afloat however to revive the Kazakh language, traditions, religion etc.

#### CLINIC WITH A HEART

A few weeks back several Lincoln South members went to the Clinic With A Heart to assemble the locking cabinets that were purchased for them with our District Simplified Grant funds. The cabinets will help with their storage and dispensing of medicines. The cabinets are large - with 5 shelves each. They can be locked. They can organize their medicines in bins and the bins fit on the shelves. They also like the fact that they can have the back of the cabinet toward the clients so that they are not able to see what is in them - making for a more secure environment. We also provided bins, self-adhesive label holders and labels (printed with lines and our Rotary Logo).

There are different volunteer pharmacists on different nights - they have each been surprised to see the new cabinets - and they have been very thrilled. We got this note from Teresa Harms, Director of the Clinic the day after one of the volunteer pharmacists worked for the first time after the cabinets were in place:

I wish you could have heard the pharmacist who was volunteering last night. He was elated with the new cabinets - I might have seen a jig. I hadn't thought about all the time these will save them in just sorting through what we have each night. We had a donation and it took him a minute to figure out where to put it. He also liked that we could put the back of the cabinets to the patients and they can't see our stock. A little safer. Thank you again for this wonderful gift. Our closet also looks lovely now.
