The 2008-09 GSE Team from District 3500 in Taiwan were our speakers for the day.

The country of Taiwan is approximately 1/6<sup>th</sup> the size of Nebraska. District 3500 is in the Northern part of Taiwan and consists of 78 clubs with 2600 members. In the last fiscal year District 3500 average \$235 per member giving to the Rotary International Foundation. This is the highest average in the world.

The area of Taiwan the group is from is called Formosa which means "beautiful island". The name originated in the 16<sup>th</sup> century. Taiwan is 36179 sq. miles and has a population of 23 million. Taiwan is known for its food, which is typically spicy, the varieties of tea (5), fruits and the night life. Because most people work during the day, many of the markets (what we would call malls or plazas) are open at night. The night markets are very popular and consist of a farmers market, food village and upscale shopping.

Taiwan is very steeped in tradition and preservation. The country has several significant festivals that are celebrated nationally, but center around family and food. Additionally, Taiwan has several national parks that are world renowned. Taiwan is the world's number one producer of computers and computer components.
