


Our own Shahid Kamal spoke to

us on Friday about his native country Pakistan. There are ecological sites in Pakistan which indicate that a very advanced civilization flourished there over 5,000 years ago. The country was originally part of the Persian empire and over the years has been a part of several empires including the

Mogul empire which was instrumental in creating a country with a separate government instead of just a group of separate empires. The East India Company became very powerful from 1857 to 1947 when India and Pakistan were separated into 2 countries. Originally there was an East Pakistan and a West Pakistan which were separated by 1,000 miles and had distinctly different languages and culture. West Pakistan became the current Pakistan.

The country is 2 times the size of California and has 160 million people. It has 3 of the highest mountains in the world and has climates ranging from hot & dry to hot humid to moderate, depending on geographic location. It has a parliamentary government with a bi cameral parliament and senate. Interestingly,

modern infrastruc-

ture, many banks, 85 universities and 29 medical schools. Every 3rd person has a cell phone and there are 20-30 TV channels as well as access to the internet. The country has the 8th largest army in the world and Pakistani pilots are considered the best. The country is also an atomic power. Squash, field hockey, polo, snooker, boxing and cricket are some of the popular sports.

Even though the country has made great progress, it still faces challenges such as the fact that 20% of the populations is below the poverty line of \$2/day and most challenging is the brain drain. Many Pakistani's leave the country to study and work which has left it intellectually poor.
