



PROGRAM

Pat Kavan with First National

Bank Omaha (and also a former President of Lincoln South Rotary) was our speaker on Friday. Pat spoke to the club about the history of the role of FNBO in the credit card industry and also shared some insights about credit cards and consumers. FNBO is the only bank in Nebraska that both issues and proc-

esses credit cards. In fact the bank processes credit card transactions for 190,000 merchants in all 50 states including such companies as Eddie Bauer and the GAP. They process 500 million transactions annually totaling over \$50 billion. Their credit card processing operation began in 1953 with just 125 merchants. The bank is the only bank in Nebraska which has been family owned for 6 generations.

Pat shared some credit card trends with the club such as the fact that 92% of all people in the US have a credit card. 67% of those use their cards regularly. He predicts that in the near future, 99% of people in the US will carry credit cards and that check books will become a thing of the past as more people use debit cards. 90% of credit card holders will use their cards regularly and 85% will make purchased on the internet. There are 3 growth areas in the credit card industry. Debit cards, Reward cards and Gift cards. For example, 5 years ago 50% of people used checks or cash for purchases. That %

has decreased to 42% today. Smart cards

with computer chips in them have become popular in Europe. They never took hold in the US however, since they are GPS trackable and Americans don't like the idea of being tracked. The newest technology to come along will allow you to use your Blackberry to move

money electronically and to pay merchants. These will be more secure than credit cards since you can add PIN's encryption etc.

Credit card use patterns have been a reliable predictor of economic trends earlier than many other economic indicators. For example in early 2007 transaction sizes began to decrease and transaction volume was down 8%. Also the types of merchandise purchased by consumers changed from luxury items to staples. Data security still remains the biggest hurdle to overcome in the virtual world and that is the area where the most R&D dollars are spent.
