## **PROGRAM**

Tonya Beckenhauer, assistant

director of the Northeast Family Center (NFC) was our speaker on Friday. The NFC is a non-profit organization committed to building strong families and vital neighborhoods educating, supporting and advocating for the diverse children and families of the community. The

NFC focuses on 3 main areas: Early Childhood, Family Support and Youth Education.

In the Early Childhood area, they have an Early Learning Center which utilizes The Creative Curriculum for kids ages 6 wks to 5 years, an Academic Preschool Program serving children 3-5 yrs of age and 3 summer mini day camps for kids ages 3-5.

In the Family Support area they have several programs including the Parents as Teachers Program for parents with children from birth to 5, Young Parent Program for past and present teen parents, and free weekly food distribution program for qualifying families.


In the area of Youth Development, the most popular program by far is the Academy of Rock which offers music classes to elementary, middle and high school students. At the end of the program, the kids perform live shows at events around the community. There is also a community learning center which is

an after school program for kids who attend Brownell elementary.

Other programs include a Strengthening Families program where group leaders facilitate interaction among family members and an ADHD tutoring and mentoring program. They use a family centered

approach to all of their programs to try match services with family needs. In some cases that may be just a referral to another program. They are all inclusive and serve all family members of all ages. The NFC partners with agencies such as Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Lincoln Literacy council, LPS, University of Nebraska and others to best meet the needs of the community. One example of this is their food distribution program where they began partnering with United Methodist Church which had a similar program to create one program which is stronger and servers more people. Most services are funded with grants and are offered at no cost to the participants and some programs are fee based.

Even though the name of the organization implies that you have to live in Northeast Lincoln to use the programs, they offer their programs to the whole city of Lincoln and the surrounding area. Their many programs are offered at multiple sites around Lincoln by their 50+ staff. members.
