Jenny Cardwell introduced Vi See who is the Executive Director of the Lincoln Action Program (LAP). Vi has been involved in the nonprofit sector for many years. She graduated from UNL with both a bachelors and master of

business degrees. She is currently a member of Rotary Club #14.

Vi stated that the Mission Statement ofthe Lincoln Action Program is: "We empower people struggling in poverty to reach their full po-

tential and achieve self-reliance." The Lincoln Action Program was established in 1965 as a community program. The three areas of programming include advocacy, direct services which is their biggest focus, and it serves as an incubator for human services. The area served is Lancaster and Saunders counties. Currently there is 100 staff working in 20 distinct programs with an annual budget of 10 million dollars.

The factors of poverty in the United States include unfavorable economic conditions, income shock, mental illness or disability, first generation of immigrants, lack of educational attainment and skills, substance abuse, domestic abuse, birth of a child, national or other types of disasters and limited job opportunities. The national poverty guideline for a one person household is \$10,830. In a two person household it is \$14,570.

> The Lincoln Action Program has implemented a strategic plan to better decide the use of resources to fight poverty. However, the focus is on self reliance.

> Basic needs for clients include: utilities assistance. rent assistance, free evening meals at the Gathering Place, and a client incentive store.


Some of LAP's other programs include: Health Start and Early Head Start, Homeless Voucher Program, supportive housing, a payee program for recipients of SSI and SSDI, money and savings program, career and computer education, community services such as tax preparation, and weatherization program.

In closing Vi announced that the Lincoln Action Program would soon be undergoing a name change to Community Action of Lancaster and Saunders Counties.

ROTARY MINUTE

5,000 children in the world under age 5 die every day from unsafe water and poor sanitation and hygiene. Rotarians are putting 1,250 bio-sand filters into homes in the Dominican Republic through a \$150,000 project supported by a Rotary Foundation Matching Grant. This is the most recent undertaking in RI District 4060's Children's Safe Water Alliance which has helped bring 19,000 filters and clean water to 100,000 people in 300 communities in just seven years.



By 2009, more than 150 clubs in Canada, the Dominican Republic, The United States and other countries had contributed almost \$1 million to the Children's Safe Water Alliance, including funds from 30 Matching Grants.
