One of the educational programs

supported by the Rotary Foundation is the Ambassadorial Scholarship program which is the oldest and best-known program of the Foundation. We were fortunate on Friday to have Sheena Cheng who is an inbound Ambassadorial Scholar from Hong Kong.

Sheena is the first member of her family to speak

English and to graduate college. She has worked for Mercedes Benz and Pier One Imports. She has always had a passion for community service and was a Rotaract member for 6 years in her home city. Her sponsor club is the Tai Po club in Hong Kong.

Her first impressions of the US included snow, farms, cowboys and corn.

Sheena showed the club slides of her country. She is from a fishing village with a population of 1,000 which is a self sustaining place that produces its own rice and fish. Farming families are allowed to have more kids to help with the farm work.



Her sponsor club helps with Polio and Hepatitis B immunization for mainland China. Also a doctor from her sponsor club has a new project called Stand Tall for the 68,000 dead and 350,000 amputees and injured from an earthquake that hit mainland China this year.

She is currently studying in the Corporate Communication Certificate Program at Creighton. Her plan is to learn, to serve, to share and to get involved in our Rotary projects.


