Thanks to Chris Dietz who took notes for the newsletter this week

Chris Dietz introduced husband, Dave Dietz, who is currently the Manager of Resource Development and Acqui-

sition for the Municipal Energy Agency of Nebraska. He began a 32 vear career at the Omaha Public Power District beginning in 1974 as an engineer. He was assigned to the coal plant start up in Nebraska City in 1979. He was part of the team that developed and

brought wholesale energy marketing business in 1995. He ended his career as Division Manager of Production Operations in 2006. Mr. Dietz has a Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln. He is a Registered Professional Engineer in the State of Nebraska.

The topic for the day was MEAN and Wind Energy Generation in Nebraska. Mean is a non-profit, member owned organization providing electricity, natural gas and utility related services to nearly 200 member communities across seven Midwestern and mountain states. NMPP Energy promotes the benefits of join action and local utility control among its member communities.

An early project of MEAN was the demonstration project in 1998 involving the Springview Partnership with NPPD, LES. Grand Island, Auburn and KBR. The first utility scale project in Nebraska occurred is 2002. It is called the MEAN

Wind Project at Kimball, Nebraska.

This Wind Project is the first utility scale project in Nebraska and began commercial


operation in October 2002. It has even 1.5 MW turbines and is a Class IV/V wind site which has a 35% capacity factor. The Project took 18 months from planning to completion.

Mr. Dietz stated that in today's market, it would not be possible to achieve such a project in 18 months. The Project cost \$14 million. The

success of the project includes good transmission access, a high level of enthusiasm for the project locally, and MEAN member interest. Over 30 MEAN members purchase wind production monthly.


Some of the challenges and lessons learned were the reliability and availability of turbines, gearbox failures, generator failures, and the need for new software to evaluate performance. There is a need for reliable operations and maintenance for wind projects. The conditions are difficult when work occurs 230 feet above ground in a windy area. It is a very specialized industry. Financially wind energy required a large capital investment which can run \$2000-\$3000 per kilowatt. It is more difficult to finance using traditional municipal financing methods.

The future directions that MEAN intends to go are to purchase production instead owning, purchase small percentages of large projects, retain 5-10% of total energy mix in wind generation, and respond to member needs and goals which is local control, not legislative mandate.



### **ROTARY MINUTE**

During the first Rotary club meeting on 23 February 1905 in Chicago, Paul Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Hiram Shorey, and Silvester Schiele met to talk about their personal experiences. Harris then unfolded his general plan for their club meetings.



Rotarians continue to take pride in their history. In honor of that first club, Rotarians have preserved its original meeting place, Room 711 in Chicago's Unity Building, by re-creating the office as it existed in 1905. For several years, the Paul Harris 711 Club maintained the room as a shrine for visiting Rotarians. In 1989, when the building was scheduled to be demolished, the club carefully dismantled the office and salvaged the interior, including doors and radiators. In 1993, the RI Board of Directors set aside a permanent home for the restored Room 711 at RI World Headquarters in the Chicago suburb of Evanston

## Rotary International Standard Procedure for Membership Proposal:

- I. The prospective member's name is submitted to the board of directors
- II. The board ensures that the person is fully qualified and approves or disapproves of the proposal
  - Objections are to be submitted to the club secretary (or to any other Board Member in the event the Secretary is the proposer) by the deadline posted.
  - It will be appropriate to assume approval in the absence of objections by the posted deadline.
  - The proposer is notified by the club secretary of the Board's approval (or disapproval). UNTIL THIS APPROVAL IS GRANTED, PROSPECTIVE MEMBERS SHOULD NOT BE INFORMED THAT THEY HAVE BEEN PROPOSED FOR MEMBERSHIP
- III The prospective member's name is published to the club
  - If no objections are received by the deadline following the publication of the name, that person, upon payment of an admission fee (secured by the proposer) is a new Rotarian
- IV The prospective member is informed of privileges and responsibilities of the club membership by proposer.
  - He or she is then asked to complete the membership application form and submit along with their dues payment.
- V. Any and all communications within these procedures may be in person, in writing, by phone, by fax, by email, or by any other physical or electronic means available to the Board Member.
