Our speaker for the day was JoAnn McCoy. She is a graduate of the

University of Arkansas in radio and television news. She is currently a realtor with Woods Brothers. She is very interested in educating people. She "gets a kick by talking to crowds."

Her topic was the \$8000 first time buyer tax

credit. She stated that the purpose of the credit is to stimulate the economy. The deadline for application of the tax credit is December 1, 2009. The tax credit is only for first time homebuyers which are defined as anyone who has not owned a home in the last 3 years. There are certain income limits which apply to those who are eligible for the tax credit. If the property is sold within three years the \$8000 must be repaid.

The tax credit is a direct reduction of tax liability so it is much more powerful than a deduction.

She stated that the bill may be extended past the December 1st deadline.

The housing crisis led to the tax credit bill. Many homeowners couldn't afford their home and were foreclosed on and some walked away from their mortgage. She stated

that housing is a large and an important part of the economy. It requires the services of contractors, subcontractors, realtors, home improvement stores, and manufacturing companies.

Many areas are suffering due to the housing crisis and jobless rate. Current mortgage interest rates are below 6%. Mrs. McCoy stated that the market in Lincoln is improving.

Bernie Poppe and Clay Ehlers were recognized by Past President Sandy Taylor for their service in the 2008/2009 year. Clay Ehlers was Vocational Service Director and Bernie Poppe was membership chair. Bernie also was presented with Rotarian of the Year. Congratulations Bernie!
