

#### **PROGRAM**

District Governor Rich Rowland

visited the club on Friday. He met with the Board before the meeting and then spoke to the club. Rich told the club that he has visited 28 clubs so far and he always uses Lincoln South as an example to other clubs for many different reasons including the fact that 90% of our members are Paul Harris Fellows and our average per capita giving

to the Foundation this year was \$180 per member which is excellent.

Governor Rowland spoke about the International Convention that he attended this summer in Birmingham England where 15,000 Rotarians from 154 countries attended. Once again the list of speakers was outstanding and one of the best parts of the convention for him. He mentioned Mia Farrow who is a polio survivor, Jane Goodall who focuses on wildlife research and education and has founded the roots and shoots program which has built wheelchairs for polio victims as one of its projects. Ban Ke Moon from the UN also addressed the convention.

Governor Rowland gave the club a polio update indicating that there are only 4 countries left with any cases of polio including Pakistan, Afghanistan, India and Nigeria so we are very close to eradicating the disease. In 2008/09 the Bill Gates Foundation gave Rotary a challenge grant of \$355 million. The goal of the district to facilitate the required match is for each member to contribute \$30 per year through 2012. Polio will remain the #1 key program for Rotary until it is eradicated.

The #2 key program for the Foundation is "Every Rotarian Every

Year" (EREY) whereby each member is asked to give \$100 to the foundation every year.

Since the engine of Rotary

is our members, Governor Rowland told the club that the district has set a goal of adding 46 net new members to the District this year. That translates to 1 net new member per club. The hope is that clubs with less than 15 members will add 1 net new member, clubs with 16-40 members will add 2 net new members and

clubs with over 40 members will add 3 net new members. Some areas to target new members are 1.) women since they currently only make up 26% of total membership in the District 2.) 30-40 year old young professionals and 3.) current membership by making sure they don't leave Rotary.

He left the club with 5 goals which have been set at the District level this year:

- 1. Leave the club better off by year end than it was at the beginning of the year.
- 2. Make membership a priority
- 3. Continue to focus on Polio eradication as the most important program
- 4. Each club choose a service project
- 5. Have Fun!!

He closed asking everyone to consider attending the District Conference next year which will be April 23rd-24th at the Embassy Suites in Omaha.
