Works Lincoln was started in Funding for this organization is through local foundations, City of Lincoln, the State of Nebraska Housing Trust Fund and Housing and Urban Development. The Mission Statement of this organization states: to help keep Lincoln a safe and prosperous community by revitalizing neighborhoods and promoting homeownership. The program offers education and support for homeownership through homebuyer education, mortgage counseling and assistance as well as post purchase homeownership classes and mortgage foreclosure prevention counseling.

Other programs that are supported by NeighborWorks are housing construction and repair, rehabilitation,

new construction; student youth build

homes, problem properties, and neighborhood stabilization programs. Neighborhood resources are utilized for these programs. They include community organizing, community volunteer projects, resident leadership projects, and mural projects. Mr. Snodgrass stated that there are currently mural projects on going in the North $27^{\rm th}$ Street area.

In a reception at the House of Lords in London, The Rotary Foundation honored Usha Mittal for her \$1 million contribution to Rotary's polio eradication effort. Usha and Lakshmi Mittal were inducted into the Arch C. Klumph Society, which honors people who give at least \$250,000 to the Foundation. Mittal and her husband, Lakshmi, chairman and CEO of ArcelorMittal, the world's largest steelmaker, live in



London. Rotary has committed to raising \$200 million over the next three years in response to \$355 million in grants from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation for polio eradication.
