What strikes me about recent elections is the lack of civility between the members of the Republican and Democratic parties. It is a “give no quarter” attitude that apparently makes some candidates or office holders believe they will appear more strident in their convictions. They are often unwilling to change or even discuss change and... they typically attempt to “ride into office” on the “consistent sound bite of a message” that the other guy or gal was completely and unreservedly bad and he or she can do much better. They also like to denigrate elected officials by calling them “politicians” (as if being a politician is pejorative). I find this quite ironic since we often pride ourselves as being the democracy the rest of the world looks up to. Lest we have forgotten our whole system of governance is based on electing people to represent us.

What this cynical approach to democracy does is make people lose faith in government. They forget that our government is us. I am reminded of the truism that for every complex problem there is a simple solution and it is usually wrong. People need to learn to discuss complex issues in detail, be willing to admit errors of logic or a lack of all the facts and then look for areas of agreement rather than dismissing the other person as inconsequential or stupid. People also need to better inform themselves so they can make reasoned thoughtful decisions. Finally the public needs to hold elected officials to the same higher standard of conduct and reasoning.

Democracy is the best system of governance but it can still have a pretty poor result if people don't bother to inform themselves or participate actively and thoughtfully in their own governance. We complain about politicians pandering to people's prejudices and baser instincts but they do so because it works. It will only not work if we have an informed, active citizenry. To that I would add a bit of compassion. One important function of Rotary is holding members to high standards of personal conduct that people in our communities can look up to and emulate

Friday was our second annual business networking day at Lincoln South. Black Hills Energy graciously agreed to host the club and provided delicious food for the meeting. Thanks to Lincoln South members Mary Simmons and Jane Krenke who organized another successful event.

Larry Byrnes who is the Operations manager at Black Hills Energy was our speaker for the day and spoke to the club about the company. The Black Hills footprint includes natural gas production, coal mines, oil production, energy marketing, natural gas utilities and electric utilities. Black Hills has 197,000 customers in 106 communities in the state. There are 475 employees domiciled in Nebraska and Lincoln and Omaha both house some of the corporate functions of the company.

Program services in the Lincoln area include local distribution services, appliance tech services and automated meter reading. There are 4 regions in Nebraska, North-Columbus and Norfolk, Omaha metro, Lincoln and South-Beatrice. The Lincoln region covers Lancaster, Cass and Otoe counties where 64 employees cover 13 communities with 97,000 customers.



Some of the major projects in recent years in the Lincoln region include automated meter reading in 12 communities and steel and copper service line replacement totaling 1,000 service lines/year in the last 5 years. The lines are replaced with a polyethylene plastic line which is smaller than the steel & copper lines and fits inside the lines. This avoids having to dig up the original line and disrupt proper-

ties. One new project that is very exciting is the implementation of the SCADA system which is an automated data acquisition system that records pressures around the city and provides real time data 24/7. The system is currently available in limited areas throughout the city.

Some of the future plans include expanding the automated meter reading system to commercial customers, implementing GE Smallworld Office Suites which is a GIS mapping system, and expanding SCADA throughout Lincoln.

Larry closed by stating sharing the vision and mission of Black Hills Energy :
