

PROGRAM

Jim Linderholm was our speaker on Friday. In addition to working for Al-

fred Bennish & Company (formerly HWS consulting), Jim is the chair of the Greater Lincoln Workforce Investment Board an agency created by the City of Lincoln to monitor workforce issues. The Board oversees the one stop career center located in Golds Galeria which houses most federal and state jobs programs.

The Board formed partnerships in 2008 with economic development and educational entities and applied for a Greater Lincoln Regional Innovation Grant. They developed a regional plan with the goal to "Enhance the pipeline of skilled workers and become a Talent Magnet". Since 25% of the metro Lincoln workforce comes from a 60 mile radius around Lincoln, a regional approach is crucial to retaining talent in the region. Nebraska is in the top 10 in the union in educational attainment and in the bottom 10 in talent retention.

The first project undertaken was Project Lead the Way which has been recently implemented by the Board in the 6 Lincoln high schools. The project allows students to take innovate technical courses and get exposure to industry to learn more about their field. For

> example they are currently working with UNL to offer dual credits with engineering department. Students get hands on experience with CADsoftware (Computer Aided Design) and get the opportunity to gain high level math

and science skills. The students are also able to take visits to engineering firms in the area where they gain invaluable experience and develop contacts in the design field. Students can apply for college credits at many colleges in Iowa, Kansas, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Minnesota and Wisconsin. UNL is still not fully accredited in the program.

The long term goal of the project is to grow to outside the Lincoln region since the entire region is import in keeping talent in Nebraska. Joint marketing in all counties is important, not just in Lincoln.
