PROGRAM

Nicki Klein introduced J.J. Yost as the guest speaker for the Rotary Program. Mr. Yost is

the Planning and Construction Manager for Lincoln Parks and Recreation. He has been emploved there for ten years. He is a 1995 graduate in civil engineering from UNL. He considers the best part of his job the variety of parks projects that he works on from trails, to pools to facilities planning.



Mr. Yost discussed the Union Plaza project, a place of discovery, gathering and celebration. This project is a three block urban park designed as part of the Antelope Valley flood and roadway project.

The project is expected to enhance the quality of life for residents and visitors. It is expected the park area will host festivals, provide education and entertainment.

The Antelope Valley Project was undertaken by three groups: the University of Nebraska, the Lower Plate South Natural Resources, and the City of Lincoln. The plan was adopted in 2000 as a flood control project. The project expected land to be reclaimed for redevelopment.

The sustainable development will employ "green" design principles and practices. Recycled materials will be displayed within the

park. There will be nature exploration opportunities for visitors. Some of the amenities will include a signature

fountain, pond plaza, children's play area, amphitheater and a scenic overlook.

The Lincoln Parks Foundation is spearheading a project called Timeless Tiles. Timeless Tiles are an inscribed, handcrafted tile in honor or in memory of a loved one or friend or a special

event. These tiles are designed by Su Harvey of Prairie Mile Tileworks. The tiles will be placed on a terraced wall in Union Plaza. Each wall will also include an image and quotation from a Nebraska author highlighting Nebraska's colorful geographical, cultural and natural heritage.

Some other features of the urban park will be a Children's Discover Garden. The play and learning area will be nature inspired. The park planners want the park area to be used extensively by residents and guests.

Union Plaza is a public and private partnership. The goal was to raise 4.5 million dollars toward park completion. Union Bank provided one and half million dollars toward the effort. The fundraising goals have been reached and the project will be completed by the fall of 2011.
