August 8th 2010 was a difficult day for me. It was the two year anniversary of the invasion of Georgia. That day in 2008 Russia invaded Georgia coming within 20 kilometers of Tbilisi, bombing and occupying Gori, Poti, Senaki , Vaziani , Marneul and Zugididi. Russia says that the war started when Georgia bombed Tskhinvali the capital of South Ossetia (in north central Georgia near the Russian bor-

der). However the EU report delivered By Swiss Diplomat Heidi Tagliavini on Sept. 30 2009 indicated that Russia had engaged in "severe long standing provocations prior to the war". It is clear that the European Union treaded lightly in its report in an effort to avoid disruption of energy supplies that much of Europe depends on from Russia. After the hostilities ceased 850 people had died and 35,000 had been displaced. Virtually all of those displaced were Georgians so any ethnic cleansing was of Georgians not Ossetians. Over 10,000 Russian troops are still occupying South Ossetia and Abkhazia two years after the war ended in violation of International Law. Most simply put Russia doesn't like Georgia because it is very western oriented. The road from the Tbilisi International Airport is George W. Bush Avenue. Georgians love the United States and all of its freedoms.

The reason I mention this incident is that the day the war started I was distraught, actually beside myself; with worry about friends in Georgia that I was afraid would be killed. I was thinking of Sandro (whom we had as an exchange student) and his family, of Salome (who was a student at my college) and her family, of Joseph, of Nino, Pavle, Tea, Eka, Giorgi and many others I knew and cared for and thought might die. I can imagine it was even worse for Lali Gogheliani, Rector of Georgian Technical University who was visiting Southeast Community college on August 8th 2008 and discussing possibilities of future collaboration. So why do I bring this up? Well the reason I was so worried about the disruption of peace in Georgia was because I knew people there and loved them dearly. It made me very motivated to encourage peaceful resolutions to political problems. Every time a Rotarian travels to another country and makes close friends there I think it makes lasting peace a bit more probable. When we host a GSE team it helps promote peace. Youth exchanges (in and outbound) help promote peace. In each of these cases good friendships are made and they endure. One of the many reasons Rotary is important to our world and future is the call to action to bridge continents
