PRESIDENT'S CORNER



I was musing this week about the social psychological concept of "bystander intervention" and "helping behaviors". These concepts have been studied in depth in a variety of contexts. Apparently many factors enter into the decision to help or not help in a given situation. Most (probably all) people appraise the costs and benefits of rewards for helping. Interestingly, one fairly com-

mon finding is that having more people present tended to reduce the likelihood of intervening. Another common finding is that people in close relationships (family, etc.) tended to intervene. Another interesting finding is that simply being asked to help significantly increased helping behaviors by 450% in one study.

A philosophy used by some for not helping was a belief in a "just world". It tended to make people feel that they were justified in not helping a sick person because they must have done something to deserve their fate.

I have a couple of reflections on this topic. Apparently two processes are at work in decisions to help or not help. People who perceive an injustice was done coupled with being asked to help and some degree of closeness to the people needing help are more likely to help. It makes sense.

I guess in Rotary we have an opportunity to expand our sense of family. We are fortunate to meet people from other countries and spend quality time with them and "low and behold" we end up caring about them. The key I think is to continue the relationships though after they (our guests) have left Lincoln. I hope that through Facebook and other social networking mechanisms we can build fledgling friendships into lasting strong ones. Maybe we each need to have a few of these (friendships) in addition to the joy of meeting others more casually.

I am reminded of the Pakistani guests who just left and other guests we welcome such as the Georgian delegation. It's a pleasure as Rotarians to make friends and be a friend to people in our community, state, nation and world.

Judy Krasomil 434-3909 udy.krasomil@nifa.org Bill Dick, Assistant District Governor, introduced Roger Carrell who is the 5650 District Governor. Mr. Carrell is from Omaha Suburban and has attended 12 international Rotary Conventions.

The challenge by Ray Klinginsmith, 2010-2011 International Rotary President, is "Bigger, Better and Bolder." According to Mr. Carrell, at the beginning of the Rotary year July 1, District 5650 has 46 clubs and 2300 members. His interest as District Governor is an emphasis on increasing membership.

He has identified goals to achieve during his tenure as 5650 District Governor. They are:

Peace and Conflict Resolution

Disease Prevention

Water and Sanitation

Maternal and Child Health

Education and Literacy

Service Goals

He believes that peace and conflict resolution will be resolved by more and better economic development. Disease prevention is currently ongoing with immunization stations set up at the borders of India, Pakistan, Afghanistan, and Nigeria so that children can be treated for polio immediately. The number of polio cases is quickly diminishing which are a credit to Rotary and the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

Water wells in Afghanistan can be purchased by Rotary clubs for around \$1500 each. He would like to see hand sanitizer provided for all schools.

The dictionary projects to local schools continue to be a good activity for local clubs. National Geographic subscriptions can be purchased for local schools at a minimal cost. Clubs will continue to determine ser-

vice goals.

Mr. Carrell states that the Rotary Foundation has an emphasis on local club donations. The money donated will come back to the club in three years.

Currently Lincoln South has a membership roster of 50 members. Mr. Carrell commended Lincoln South for that number. He states that all of us must serve on the membership committee even in an informal way. We must all recruit new members and do not limit classifications.

He believes that each Rotary Club in the district should communicate projects and fundraisers with each other. Promoting the projects in the community is important. Heifer International is a worldwide project to provide animals to families to become self sufficient.

Presidential Citations are given to clubs annually. A club must earn points in several areas to qualify for a Presidential Citation. He states that the rules are changing and that most clubs will qualify for one.

Mr. Carrell states that having fun and fellowship in Rotary is important to having an active club.

He closed with a quote by Ralph Waldo Emerson which states, "Unless you try to do something beyond what you have already mastered, you will never grow."
