

PROGRAM

Rod Bates, General Manager of NET was our speaker. Rod spoke to the club about "Public Mission, Public Funding, and Public Support - The Issues Ahead". He shared NET's mission and vision statements and dis-

cussed their core values, among them:

Service to Others Invite, honor, and respond to all ideas Provide high quality content and services

The goal of NET is not merely

entertain, but to prompt action. NET is set up, in partnership with the University and also as its own TV station. There are two foundations that support NET - one for television and one for radio. They have raised \$25 million over the past 5 years.

They have a variety of challenges facing them including the U.S. Deficit, Look-alike channels (History, Learning Channel, National Geographic Channel, A&E) and accusations of a liberal bias in their reporting.

He responded to each challenge as follows:

—If you look at the U.S. Deficit, the amount of money going towards public television is so

minute, that it is not really enough to even be noticed, were they to cut the funding.

— If you look at the channels that are mentioned as look-alike channels, you will find

that their programming content is not like NET's content at all - much of it is reality television that is sensationalized. In comparison, NET offers programs such as: Ken Burns, NOVA, Nature, Sesame Street, News Hour. Great Performances, American Experience, American Masters, and Statewide programs on special topics.

— If you look at the news today - there is not a single entity that disseminates news that does not have some type of bias.

While he maintained that most of the perception problems were with national level shows, he also indicated that they work very hard as a staff to make sure there is no bias in their reporting. He indicated that all their programs are rated high in public trust and also that they are used as educational tools.
