





The most interesting place she has vis-


ited was Normandy, France and she loves to hang out at the old farm whenever her schedule allows. Joyce joined rotary in 1989 at the invitation of Anne Hansen

DR. GEORGE J. LYTTON MEMORIAL CHALLENGE LINCOLN SOUTH ROTARY CLUB 2012-2013 ROTARY INTERNATIONAL FOUNDATION DRIVE



On Friday November 30th, Joe Roberts formally kicked off the Dr. George J. Lytton Memorial Challenge Lincoln South Rotary Club 2012-2013 Rotary International Foundation Drive. The drive will be held from December 2012 through January 2013. The motto of the drive is "Every Rotarian, Every Year" which means that the goal is to get 100% of our members to contribute \$120 to the RI Foundation. Contributions can be made in lump sum or monthly through the bank draft, or bank card programs. Any Rotarian may designate the funds to polio or annual programs funds.

On Friday January 25th the drive will conclude with a drawing for an immediate Paul Harris Fellow recognition (a \$1,000 value.) Members must have contributed at least \$300 in prior years to be eligible for the drawing.

Lincoln South has historically been one of the most generous clubs in the District, averaging 96% participation with annual contributions totaling \$9,500 or more. The per member average is \$180 or more.

104 Paul Harris Fellows have come out of the Lincoln Rotary South Club and the club has donated in excess of \$160,000 since the inception of the club


The most needed personal care items include:
