

Joyce Schmeeckle introduced Deb Shoemaker, Executive Director of the People's Health Center. Ms. Shoemaker has been the executive director for three years.

The Mission Statement of the People's Health Center is: To provide affordable, comprehensive, accessible, culturally appropriate, cost effective primary health care. We serve people in the Lincoln area, especially those individuals and families with limited resources or other barri-



ers to healthcare to improve their overall health status.

The People's Health Center is a federally qualified health center because it receives Public Health Service Act Section 330 funds, serves medically underserved areas or a medically underserved population, is an integral part of the health delivery system, is cost effective, community oriented and comprehensive. This designation also includes physical location, must be non profit or public tax exempted, provide services to all, regardless of ability to pay and provides a sliding fee scale for patients.

There are approximately 20,000 people in Lincoln that are uninsured. Language can be a barrier since not all of the patients speak or understand English. Interpreters are used for many languages although doctors can access a language line if there is no interpreter.

The advantages of this included enhanced reimbursement for Medicaid patients, public

health service drug pricing, federal and local grant funding opportunities, and medical malpractice liability protections through the Federal Torts Claim Act.

The Center opened in 2003 with 6800

square feet and an initial staff of 16 providing medical and dental services. Over 3200 patients were seen in the first three months. In 2004 construction was completed on an 8300 square foot addition.

Today the People's Health Center has a staff of 70, 15,100 square feet of space, 22 medical exam rooms, 8 dental rooms, lab area, x ray abilities, and a labo-

ratory. The major thrust of the People Health Center is to help consumers navigate and access primary care. It establishes a medical home rather than using emergency room services. Patients are often referred to other community providers as the need arises.

Current staffing includes seven medical providers including three physicians, three nurse practitioners and one physician assistant. PHC contracts with two pediatricians and three nurse midwives. There are six volunteer part time specialists. In 2010 the PHC served 11,137 patients.

To become a new patient the wait time is 8-10 weeks. Established patients only wait 1 -2 days to get into the PHC.

Ms. Shoemaker stated that the PHC is interested in operating two more satellite clinics in the Lincoln area where the underinsured can access health care as funds become available.
